The painting of the structure will hopefully occur in Phase II along the installation of shutters.

With the support of Town of Colonie staff along with FOPH volunteers, repairs are also going on in the Barn, the Carriage House, the Schoolhouse and the Tool Museum. We are doing a close review of our collections and working on site drainage issues. Many of the board committees are meeting to plan for future programs and initiatives. Couples are beginning to setup tours with Site Curator Tami Sherry in hopes of 2021 and 2022 weddings at the site. We envision ourselves operational in 2021.

Mark your calendar for the first weekend of December (Saturday & Sunday, Dec. 5th & 6th). FOPH will be hosting a winter scene complete with a historic sleigh directly in front of the Pruyn House where you can have your family holiday photo taken for a nominal fee. he Town of Colonie and the Friends of Pruyn House have been working diligently to continue to preserve this beautiful Historical and Cultural Complex for the community to enjoy. We are proud of the work on the exterior of the Pruyn House and are continuing to renovate this beautiful structure. The painters are hard at work right now painting the soffits and window trim and new grass has been planted. The windows have been completely refurbished. The new roof and parapet are finished, the chimneys have been repointed and all the drainage issues have been solved.

Please watch for these fun projects over the next year: new shutters on the Pruyn House, new roof on the Carriage House, roofing repairs on the Buhrmaster Barn and roofing repairs on the outdoor restroom building.

We are also undertaking a structural analysis of the beautiful curved staircase to determine how to best strengthen and preserve the staircase and railing.

In addition, we are continuing to plan for Phase II of our exterior lighting project, which we hope to accomplish over the next two years.

There are many more repairs which will occur over the winter and spring; including woodwork repairs to the Schoolhouse, Buhrmaster Barn, Carriage House and Tool Museum.
